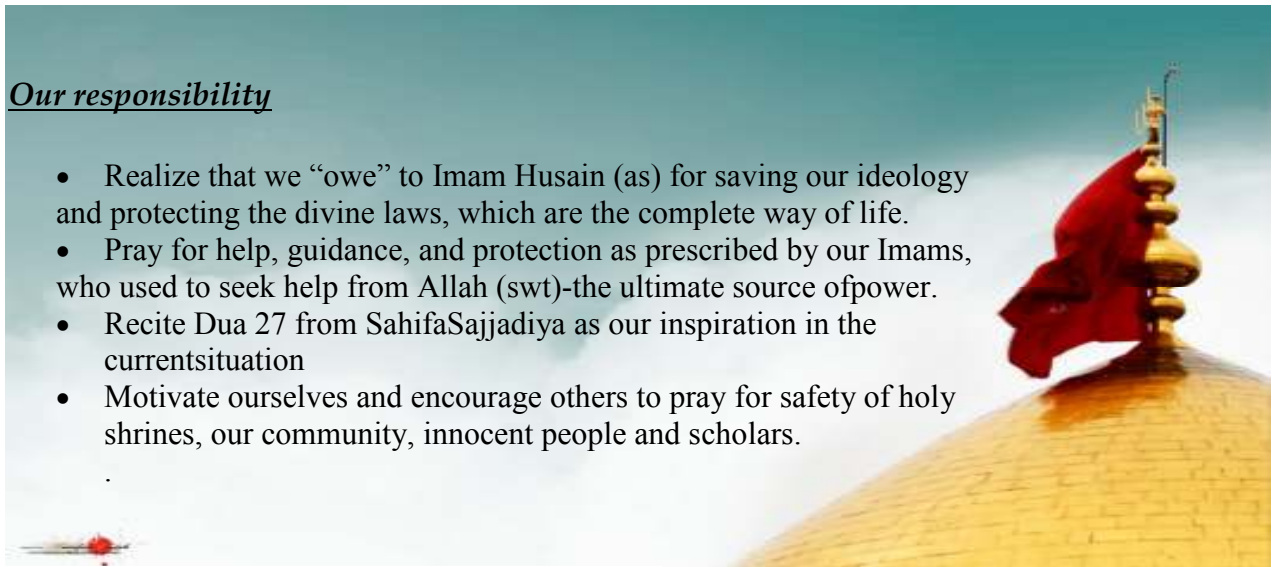
Reason for the Day of Remembrance/Dua

- Thousands of people have been maimed and slaughtered.

- Women are killed or kidnapped and sold as slaves
- Several Shia and other communities have been forced to convert or killed.
- Churches are desecrated and Iraqi Christian population is reduced by more than 50%.
